Happy Winter, Pit Stop Family:

In an abundance of caution, we are providing all current Pit Stop subscribers with a detailed winterization email of the pool equipment bay. We learned in February 2021, that communication is compromised during a power outage, as internet and cell coverage are diminished, hence the proactiveness.

CAUTION – <u>DO NOT COMPLETE THE STEPS DESCRIBED BELOW UNLESS</u> temperatures are below 35 degrees, <u>AND</u> you experience an extended loss of power.

What do I do if I can't run my equipment because I have no power or because my equipment is frozen?

- MOST IMPORTANT Turn off the breakers to ALL pool equipment.
- Remove all pump lids and GENTLY unscrew the thumb screw drain plugs on each pump. They are brittle when cold. By removing these plugs, you will drain out the water from the pump. Please take care to keep both the plugs and associated orings, as they are both required to seal the pump back up once power is restored.

- Open the air pressure relief valve on top of the filter.


- Unscrew the drain plug of the filter. There will be an oring with the plug that needs to be kept together.

- o Sand filter drain plugs are located in the same vicinity as those show above.
- GENTLY unscrew the drain plug on the heater manifold. The heater is the most expensive piece of equipment in the bay. It is advised to also wrap the manifold with towels/blankets AND cover the heater, especially the lower portion of the heater where the <u>heat exchanger</u> is located.
